- ~ Lots of other good stuff!



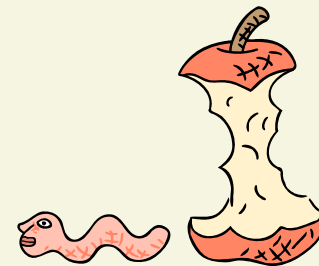
What is a worm bin?
