## PRE-SCREENING



## PRE-ARRIVAL SHELTER IN PLACE



**14-Day Pre-Camp Health Screen:** All guests and camp staff will be required to complete a daily screening leading up to the first day of camp. This provided form includes screening questions, temperature, and symptom checks and is due on check-in day.

We suggest all guests **limit travel and contact with others** during the 14 days leading up to the first day of camp.

## PPE



**PPE:** All guests are encouraged to bring a **minimum of 1 mask per day** to camp. Masks must be clearly marked with the name of the wearer. Clean, spare masks must be kept in a sealed and labeled plastic bag. The camp will maintain an adequate supply of disposable masks. Masks must be worn unless sleeping, eating, showering, or when outside and 6-ft distanced from others. **UK "Mask Up" Guidelines:** <https://www.uky.edu/coronavirus/do-your-part/mask>

## DISINFECTING & CLEANING



**Hand Washing/Sanitizing:** Soap and water hand washing stations will be available at high traffic areas around camp and in all restrooms. Hand sanitizer stations will be used as a supplementary step and provided in each cabin, activity area, and high traffic areas. Personal hand sanitizer is recommended for all guests. **Daily Cleaning:** High touch surfaces will be cleaned and sanitized continuously throughout the day. Program equipment will be sanitized after each use.

## DAILY HEALTH SCREENING



**Daily Screening:** Camp Staff will be screened daily during each camp session. Campers, Volunteers, and Extension Staff will self-screen daily and report any COVID-like symptoms to the Camp Health Care Provider.

Any individual with **COVID-like symptoms** will be isolated immediately in the Health Office and may not remain at camp. Parents/Guardians must make arrangements to pick-up their minor at their earliest opportunity.

## COHORTING



## ALTERED ACTIVITIES



**Cohorting:** We are limiting our activity groups to no more than two cabins per team. Teams will travel together to and from activities with no close interaction with other teams. Physical distance and mask mandates will be in place.

**Physical Distance (PD):** Camp capacity has been decreased to 50% to allow for appropriate PD between bunk beds, during meal times, and activities. Whole-camp activities have been altered to ensure PD is maintained at all times.

## VENTILATION OF INDOOR SPACES



**Ambient Air Flow:** The doors and windows of some camp facilities will remain open at all times to increase ambient air flow and ventilation.

**Air Filters:** All cabins and dining facilities will have MERV-13 air filters or in the air-conditioning units to ensure appropriate air filtration and comfort.
