2025 Oldham County Fair Entry Day

All departments will be accepting entries at the Oldham County Cooperative Extension Office, located at 205 Parker Drive in La Grange, between 3:00 and 7:00 p.m. on Monday, July 21.

General Rules for Fair

1. Exhibits are open to all Oldham County residents and members of the Oldham County Extension Homemakers.
2. All departments will have entries for Adult and Youth divisions (17 years and younger as of July 1, 2025).
3. Exhibitors are encouraged to submit paper pre-registrations to the Extension office by July 21. **Entries will be accepted at the Oldham County Extension office on Monday, July 21, 2025 between 3:00 p.m. and 7:00 pm.**
4. All entries must be home-grown, home-made, or hand-made by the exhibitor themselves.
5. All professional work is banned from this department. Anybody who derives the major part of their income from the type of work being exhibited is considered a professional.
6. Each class entry must have the correct number of exhibits/articles to qualify for premiums.
7. Premium checks will be mailed to winners by Oldham County Extension office.
8. During judging, no one will be allowed in the exhibition hall except judges. All ribbons won on articles must remain on same articles until checkout time.
9. Premium money for all **classes** (except Vegetable Display Division) will be awarded First - \$6, Second - \$4, Third - \$2, and will be mailed to winners by the Oldham County Extension office.
10. Best in Show will also be awarded to each **division**, excluding Vegetable Display, according to department rules.
11. An exhibit showcase open to the public will be held, Wednesday, July 23, 2025 starting at 1:00 pm. A reception will be held from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. that evening after which all exhibits will be released. Fair exhibits may also be picked up Thursday, July 24, 2025 from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Any exhibit not claimed during this time will be disposed of by the Oldham County Extension office.

Rules and Regulations (Please See General Rules in Addition To): Agriculture Department

1. All entries must be home-grown.
2. No exhibit that has received a premium award for this fair may be used in a different fair.
3. No exhibits/articles may be used in more than one class or division.
4. No more than two exhibits shall be made from one household per class, and only one entry per person per class.
5. Fruit and Vegetable entries must be displayed on a sturdy disposable plate provided by the exhibitor themselves.
6. See general rules for premiums. Vegetable Display Division premiums will be: First - \$10, Second - \$8, Third - \$6, Fourth - \$2, and Fifth - \$1.
7. Best in Show will be awarded to a single entry in each division, excluding Vegetable Display. The award will be \$25 and a Best in Show Ribbon.




Floral Department

Premiums in all classes will be First - \$6, Second - \$4, Third - \$2. There will be Youth (18 and under as of July 1, 2025) and Adult divisions. A Grand Champion will be chosen for each division based on points.

Rules and Regulations (Please See General Rules in Addition To): Floral Department

1. Exhibitors may only have one entry per class.
2. Each arrangement must be in a suitable container and be judged on artistry, originality and thoughtfulness. The Extension Office will take extra care of containers but cannot be responsible for them.
3. All single and multi-stem flowers and foliage must be in a container that will suitably support the entry.
4. No fruits, artificial flowers, or artificial foliage allowed.
5. See general rules for premiums. Best of Show will be awarded to a single entry in each division. The award will be \$25 and a Best in Show ribbon.

Rules and Regulations:

1. Best in Show will be awarded to a single Youth Exhibitor (17 & younger) and Adult Exhibitor (18+). Award will be \$25.
2. Any item entered in the Home & Family Arts Department must be:
 - a. Handmade, and the work of the participant.
 - b. Made since the 2024 Oldham County Fair.
3. All canned items must be in a standard glass canning jar either wide-mouth or regular mouth with metal lids, rings and no label. 

4. All baked goods should be on a substantial paper plate covered with clear plastic wrap or in a clear plastic bag.

- a. Baked good quantities: half loaf of bread, 4 rolls/muffins, half of a cake, 6 cookies, 6 brownies, 4 cupcakes, 6 pieces of candy, 1 pie
 - b. No mixes unless specified in class.
 - c. No hot or refrigerated pies. Pies must be from scratch; no commercial mixes or pie crusts may be used.
5. Entries must use clear glass, wide-mouth mason jars or wide-mouth honey jars may be used. The jars and lids must be clean. Fill jars to within 1/2 inch of top.
 6. Honey entries must use clear wide-mouth mason jars.
 7. An exhibitor may have only one (1) entry per class.
 8. Only finished articles may be entered.
 9. Soiled articles will not be accepted.
 10. All entries will be judged and awarded based on quality.
 11. Where entries are not worthy of 1st prize, judges may at their discretion award a prize of such grade as the article deserves. Any article not up to standard in the class in which it is exhibited can be ruled out by the judges.
 12. There will be Youth (ages 6-17) and Adult (ages 18+) divisions within this department.
 13. Extension staff will use the utmost care to see that no damage or loss occurs but will not be responsible in case of loss or damage.

Best in Show will be awarded to a single Youth Exhibitor and Adult Exhibitor. Award will be \$25.

Rules and Regulations:

A reception will be held from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 23, after which all exhibits will be released. Fair exhibits may also be picked up Thursday, July 24, from 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. Any exhibit not claimed during this time, will be disposed of by the Oldham County Extension Office.

1. Photos must be the original work of the entrant. Only one entry per class per person.
2. All professional work is banned from this department. Anyone who derives the major part of their income from the type of work being exhibited is considered a professional.
3. A copy of a photograph entered in one class may not be entered in any other class even if it is processed in a different color.
4. All photos must be mounted. Foam core mounts or overlay mats are acceptable, provided the total thickness does not exceed one-fourth of an inch. Plastic shrink fit covering is permitted. Glass or frames are not permitted.
5. The photographic image must not be smaller than 5 x 7" but no larger than 16 x 20."
6. All entries must be clearly marked on the back with the name and phone number of the photographer. Do not write on the photos.
7. Judging will be based on technical quality, originality, and composition of the photograph. Decision of the judges is final.
8. The immediate families of the judges are not eligible to enter.
9. All general rules, as stated in the catalog and the Kentucky State Fair catalog, apply to the photography competition.
