Agriculture Department

Premiums: Premium money offered

Closed Exhibits: Oldham County residents only

Rules and Regulations:

1. All entries must be home-grown. The agriculture exhibit will be open to all Oldham County residents. There will be a youth division (18 years and younger as of July 1, 2024) and an adult division within this department.
2. Entries will be accepted at the Oldham County Extension Office on Monday, July 22, 2024, between 3:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.
3. All fruits and vegetables are to be displayed on sturdy disposable plates. Exhibitors must provide disposable plates for their exhibits.
4. A reception will be held from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 24, after which all exhibits will be released. Fair exhibits may also be picked up Thursday, July 25 from 8:00 a.m. –12:00 p.m. Any exhibit not claimed during this time, will be disposed of by the Oldham County Extension Office.
5. No article that has taken one premium at this fair shall compete for another, and no article shown singly can be shown in a collection, and no article in a collection can be shown singly.
6. Each class entry must have the correct number of exhibits/articles to qualify for premiums. No more than two exhibits shall be made from one household in any one class, and only one entry per person per class.
7. Premium checks will be mailed to winners by the Oldham County Extension Office.
8. During judging, no one will be allowed in the exhibition hall except judges. All ribbons won on articles must remain on same articles until checkout time.
9. Premium money for all class entries except vegetable display will be: First - \$6, Second - \$4, Third - \$2.
10. Vegetable display (class 365) will be: First - \$10, Second - \$8, Third - \$6, Fourth - \$2, and Fifth - \$1.
11. GRAND CHAMPION will be based on a points system and awarded in Youth and Adult Divisions. Fruit and bramble entries do not count toward points for Grand Champion. Vegetable Display (Class 365) will serve as a tie-breaker if needed. Award will be a Grand Champion Ribbon.
12. BEST OF SHOW will be awarded to a single entry in each division, excluding class 365 Vegetable Display. Award will be \$25 and a Best of Show Ribbon.

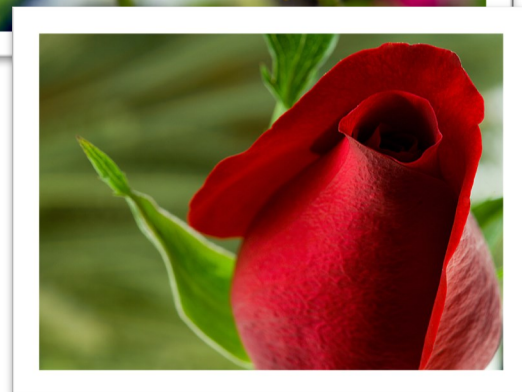


Floral Department

Premiums in all classes will be First - \$6, Second - \$4, Third - \$2. There will be Junior (18 and under as of July 1, 2024) and Adult divisions. A Grand Champion will be chosen for each division based on points.

Rules and Regulations:

1. Exhibitor must be a resident of Oldham County.
2. All professional work is banned from this department. Anyone who derives the major part of their income from the type of work being exhibited is considered a professional.
3. Exhibitor may have only one entry per class.
4. All entries must be homegrown by the exhibitor.
5. All entries must be entered between 3:00 and 7:00 p.m. on Monday, July 22, 2024 at the Oldham County Extension Office, located at 205 Parker Drive in La Grange.
6. A reception will be held from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 24, after which all exhibits will be released. Fair exhibits may also be picked up Thursday, July 25, from 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. Any exhibit not claimed during this time, will be disposed of by the Oldham County Extension Office.
7. Each arrangement must be in a suitable container and be judged on artistry, originality and thoughtfulness. The Extension Office will take extra care of containers but cannot be responsible for them.
8. All single and multi-stem flowers and foliage must be in container that will suitably support the entry.
9. No fruits, artificial flowers, or artificial foliage allowed.

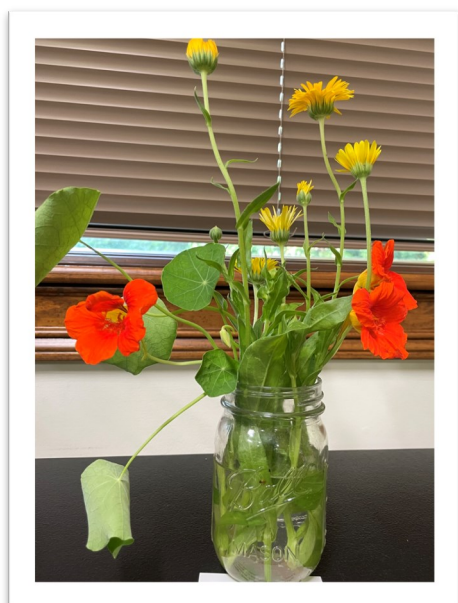

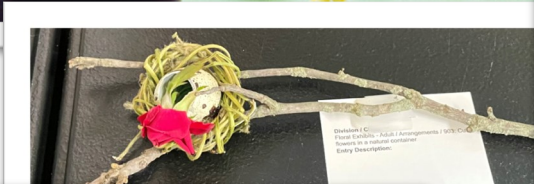
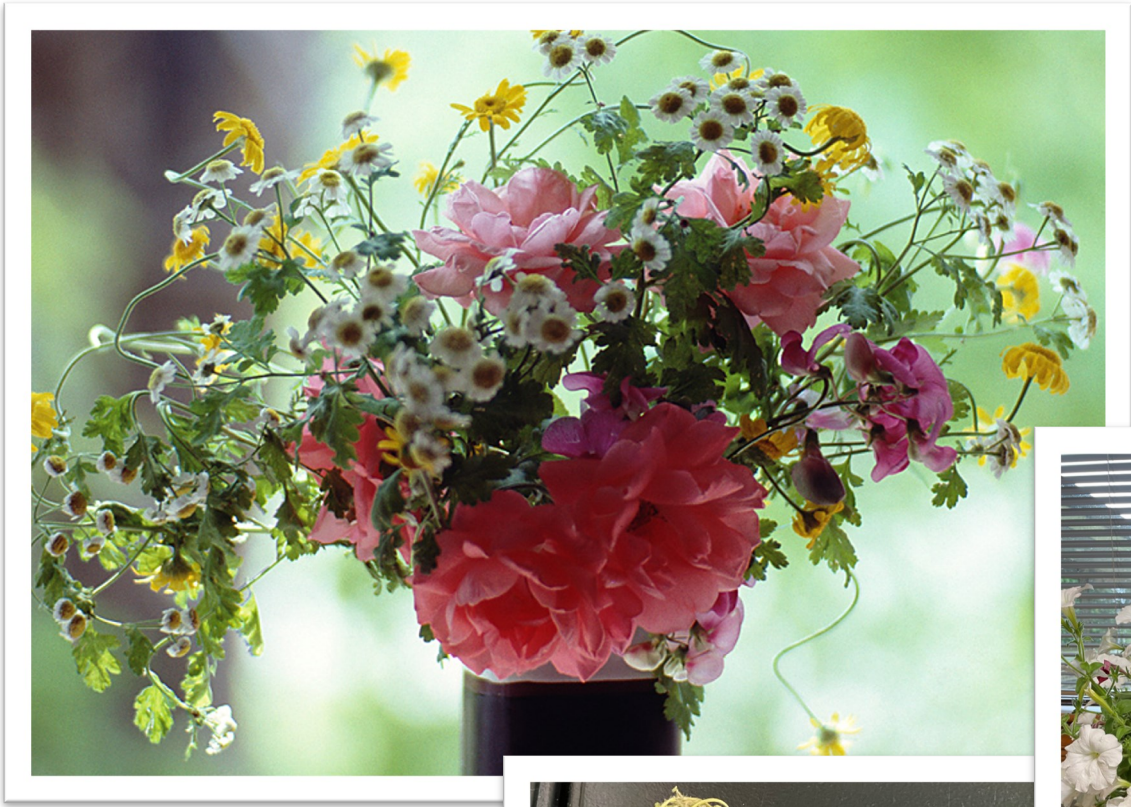

Rules and Regulations:

1. Premium money in all classes will be: First - \$6, Second - \$4, Third - \$2
2. GRAND CHAMPION will be based on a points system and awarded in Youth and Adult Divisions. Award will be a Grand Champion Ribbon
3. Best of Show will be awarded to a single entry in each division, excluding class photo. Award will be \$25 and a Best of Show ribbon.
4. Exhibitors are encouraged to submit paper pre-registrations to the Extension office by July 22.
5. Any item entered in the Home & Family Arts Department must be:
 - A. Handmade
 - B. Entirely the work of the person whose name in which it is entered.
 - C. Made since the 2023 Oldham County Fair (except in the Wine Category, where state rules apply)
6. All Home & Family Arts Department exhibits will be taken at the Oldham County Extension Office, located at 205 Parker Drive in La Grange, between 3:00 and 7:00 p.m. on Monday, July 22.
7. All professional work is banned from this department. Anyone who derives the major part of their income from the type of work being exhibited is considered a professional.
8. All canned items must be in standard canning jars with metal lids, rings and no label. Jars with rusty lids, rusty rings, or broken seals will be disqualified.
9. All baked goods should be on a substantial paper plate covered with clear plastic wrap or in a clear plastic bag.
 - A. Baked good quantities: half loaf of bread, 4 rolls/muffins, half of a cake, 6 cookies, 6 brownies, 4 cupcakes, 6 pieces of candy, 1 pie
 - B. No mixes unless specified in class.
 - C. No hot or refrigerated pies. Pies must be from scratch; no commercial mixes or pie crusts may be used.

10. Entries must use clear glass, wide-mouth mason jars or wide-mouth honey jars may be used. The jars and lids must be clean. Fill jars to within 1/2 inch of top.
11. All wines entered must have been processed by fermentation, produced and bottled exclusively by entrant. Wines may be made from grapes/fruits grown anywhere, or from grape/fruit concentrate. Wine kits and concentrated-based wines will compete side-by-side with fresh fruit and juice based wines. Wine must be contained in a standard 750 ml wine bottle and sealed with a natural or synthetic cork.
12. Entrants need to bring 2 bottles of wine for their entry: one bottle with identification of wine type and a second bottle for display. Wine grown from grapes from Oldham County will be considered for the special Oldham County Fair Wine Award.
13. Entries for the wine label contest must reflect good taste, and be submitted as it would appear on the bottle. It should be mounted on card stock that will be provided during entry time.
14. An exhibitor may have only one (1) entry per class.
15. Only finished articles may be entered.
16. Soiled articles will not be accepted.
17. Where there is only one exhibitor in a class, 1st prize, merited, will be awarded.
18. Where there is competition, all prizes may be awarded as far as there are worthy entries.
19. Where entries are not worthy of 1st prize, judges may at their discretion award a prize of such grade as the article deserves. Any article not up to standard in the class in which it is exhibited can be ruled out by the judges.
20. A reception will be held from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 24, after which all exhibits will be released. Fair exhibits may also be picked up Thursday, July 25, from 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. Any exhibit not claimed during this time, will be disposed of by the Oldham County Extension Office.
21. There will be Junior and Senior Divisions within this department. Juniors must be 6-18 years old by July 1, 2024. Seniors must be 62 years or older as of July 1, 2024.
22. Exhibits in the Junior and Senior Divisions will be judged separately on their own merit.
22. The management will use the utmost care to see that no damage or loss occurs but will not be responsible in case of loss or damage.
23. All exhibitors must be Oldham County residents or members of the Oldham County Extension Homemakers.

Exhibits may be entered on Monday, July 22 from 3:00 to 7:00 p.m. at the Oldham County Extension Office, located at 205 Parker Drive in La Grange.

A reception will be held from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 24, after which all exhibits will be released. Fair exhibits may also be picked up Thursday, July 25, from 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. Any exhibit not claimed during this time, will be disposed of by the Oldham County Extension Office.

1. Entrant must be a resident of Oldham County. There will be a Junior Division (18 and under as of July 1, 2024) and an Adult Division.
2. Photos must be the original work of the entrant. Only one entry per class per person.
3. All professional work is banned from this department. Anyone who derives the major part of their income from the type of work being exhibited is considered a professional.
5. A copy of a photograph entered in one class may not be entered in any other class even if it is processed in a different color.
6. All photos must be mounted. Foam core mounts or overlay mats are acceptable, provided the total thickness does not exceed one-fourth of an inch. Plastic shrink fit covering is permitted. Glass or frames are not permitted.
7. The photographic image must not be smaller than 5 x 7" but no larger than 16 x 20."
8. All entries must be clearly marked on the back with the name and phone number of the photographer. Do not write on the photos.
9. Judging will be based on technical quality, originality, and composition of the photograph. Decision of the judges is final.
10. The immediate families of the judges are not eligible to enter.
11. Entries will be awarded on merit.
12. All general rules, as stated in the catalog and the Kentucky State Fair catalog, apply to the photography competition.
